



The festival lasts for three days in May.





#### 1. Bahu Mela

Bahu Mela Festival is celebrated twice a year, from March to April and September to October, at the 3000 years old Bahu Fort.

### 2. Purmandal Mela

Purmandal Mela is a three day fair organised at a venue located about 39 kilometers from Jammu, on the occasion of Shivaratri.

It is a celebration of Lord Shiva's marriage to Goddess Parvati.













### 3. Pahalgam Festival

Pahalgam Festival is celebrated with the arrival of spring, and is a gala event which is marked by artists, performances and a variety of events.

Other events which are a part of this festival are tonga rides, village walks, cultural zones, kid zones, stand up comedy, musical events, street food corners and art exhibitions.













### 4. Shikara Festival

The Shikara Festival is celebrated on the pristine waters of the Dal Lake.

During the festival various events are being held including Shikara Race, Dragon Boat Race and Canoe Polo Match besides cultural programmes depicting traditional heritage and culture of Kashmir.
