What is a noun? (संज्ञा)

A noun functions as the name of a specific object or set of objects, such as living creatures, places, actions, qualities, or ideas.

Examples:

- Abhishek and his dog are inseparable.
- Albert Einstein was born in Germany.
- I visited the *Taj Mahal* in *Agra*.
- Ravi goes for swimming classes every Friday.

A common noun is a name for a type of thing, person, species, or etc. which denotes a **general name** for something.

Common nouns do not define any particular person, place or thing.

Ex. Boy, girl, doctor, town, city, dog, car and so on.

- Teachers teach in school.
- Birds live on trees.











Proper Nouns



A proper noun is a name of someone/something which denotes a particular person/thing. Proper nouns always begin with a capital letter.

Examples:

- I used to live in Bhopal.
- Last year we visited the Qutub Minar.
- The *Ganga* is a sacred river.











Concrete Nouns



A concrete noun is a noun which refers to people and to things that **exist physically** and can be seen, touched, smelled, heard, or tasted.

Examples: Chair, table, bat, ball, water, money, sugar, etc.











Abstract Nouns



An abstract noun refers to ideas, qualities, and conditions - things that cannot be seen or touched and things which have no physical reality.

Examples:

- Kindness is something almost everyone appreciates.
- Our friendship will last forever.









Collective Nouns



A collective noun is the name given to a **group** of people, animals, places, or things.

Example:

- A group of people crowd
- A group of players team
- A group of keys bunch
- A group of bees/insects swarm
- A group of wolves pack











Countable & Uncountable Nouns



Countable nouns are those that refer to something that can be counted.

Examples: Pen, hat, house, chair, book, fish, etc.

Similarly, the nouns that **cannot be counted** are called uncountable nouns.

Examples: Water, air, love, honesty, hair, happiness, salt, etc.
