







WHAT ARE SUBJECTS & OBJECTS?

Remember our rule of thumb:


- The subject is the person or thing doing something.
- The **object** is having something **done to it**.

Example:

- 1. The faculty member is teaching the students.
- 2. Shivam plays with the xbox everyday.
- 3. I lit the candles.









WHAT IS VOICE?

Voice in English Grammar expresses the relationship of the subject to the action. Voice has two categories:

1. Active Voice: The subject does the action (verb)

2. Passive Voice: The subject receives the action (verb)

Example:


Active: John Green wrote The fault in our stars.

Passive: The fault in our stars was written by John Green.















Some more examples:

Example: (1) Active: Majestic tigers roam the Sunderbans.

Passive: The Sunderbans is roamed by majestic tigers.

(2) **Active:** A forest fire destroyed the whole suburb.

Passive: The whole suburb was destroyed by a forest fire.

1. Simple Present Tense:

Active Voice	Passive Voice
Subject + V1 + s/es + Object	Object + is/am/are + V3 + by + subject


Examples:

- 1. He plays football.
- 2. He does not cook food.

Football is played by him. Food is not cooked by him.













2. Present Continuous Tense:

Active Voice	Passive Voice
Subject + is/am/are + V1+ ing + Object	Object + is/am/are + being + V3 + by + Subject

Examples:

- 1. Rahul is writing a letter.
- 2. Kamal is cutting the trees.

A letter is being written by Rahul. The trees are being cut by Kamal.













3. Present Perfect Tense:

	Active Voice	Passive Voice
S	subject + has/have+ V3+ Object	Object + has/have+ been+ V3 + by + Subject

Examples:


- 1. Avinash has composed this song. ---- This song has been composed by
 - Avinash.













1. Simple Past Tense:

Active Voice	Passive Voice
Subject + V2 + Object	Object + was/were + V3 + by + Subject

Examples:

- 1. I bought a cycle.
- 2. We shared the bills.

A cycle was bought by me.
The bills were shared by us.













2. Past Continuous Tense:

Active Voice	Passive Voice
Subject + was/were + V1+ ing + Object	Object + was/were + being + V3 + by + Subject

Examples:


1. Akhil was working on the project. —— The project was being worked on by

2. She was writing a letter.

A letter was being written by her.











Akhil.





3. Past Perfect Tense:

Active Voice	Passive Voice
Subject + had + V3 + Object.	Object + had + been + V3 + by + Subject

Examples: 1. I had cleaned the swimming pool. —— The swimming pool had been cleaned by me. 2. Ravi had purchased a new camera. — A new camera had been purchased by Ravi.















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1. Simple Future Tense:

Active Voice	Passive Voice
Subject + will + V1+ Object.	Object + will + be + V3 + by + Subject

Examples:

- 1. I will visit Manali.
- 2. Ravi will eat vegetarian food.

 Manali will be visited by me.
Vegetarian food will be eaten by Ravi.











2. Future Perfect Tense:

Active Voice	Passive Voice
Subject + will + have + V3 + Object	Object + will + have + been + V3 + by + subject

Examples:

1. Mohan will have watched the film. — The film will have been

watched by Mohan.

2. Ravi will have bought the toy.

The toy will have been bought by Ravi,
