What is Critical Reasoning (CR)?



Critical reasoning tests an aspirant's ability to actively and skillfully grasp, analyze, question and evaluate ideas and beliefs given in a passage.

In XAT, CR is generally composed of a short paragraph followed by a question on the basis of the paragraph. For example, 'support the argument', 'find the assumption', 'find the inference', 'find the conclusion', etc.

TERMINOLOGIES!



Premise is a statement of fact or evidence explicitly stated.



When a premise is not stated, or the author has taken it for granted, it becomes an assumption.



A conclusion is an opinion that the author wants to prove by using premises or assumptions.



Combination of Premise and Conclusion.

An example



Paragraph:

Dogs with long hair shed all over the house so you shouldn't get a long-haired dog. I have also heard that they have lots of fleas.

Let's find the premises and conclusion.

Premise 1: Long-haired dogs shed all over the house.

Premise 2: Long-haired dogs have a lot of fleas.

Conclusion: You should not get a long haired dog.


























Tips!



1. Option which diverts attention:

Let's say you're required to strengthen the conclusion, but the option diverts the attention by strengthening the premise.

2. Incompatible comparisons:

Always compare "apple to apple". Example: More people died in road accidents than that due to COVID-19 in a year. Hence, COVID-19 is not dangerous.

3. Correlation & Causation:

Two events may take place simultaneously but this does not mean that one event caused the other. Correlation does not mean causation.

4. Circular Reasoning:

Example: US is the best place to live, because it's better than any other country.















Q.1 Read the following paragraph and answer the question that follows:



The average life expectancy for the Indian population as a whole is 73.9 years, but children born in Odisha will live an average of 77 years, and those born in Gujarat, 73 years. Unfortunately for travelers, there is no worldwide database for recent jellyfish sightings, and tourism officials are sometimes reluctant to publicize jellyfish swarms out of fear that such news will scare off visitors.
